

AVRP's Leadership Team Celebrates 30 Years as Partners

Trio leads a team of creative problem solvers who have designed more than \$3 billion worth of construction projects

This month a milestone will be reached at <u>AVRP Studios</u> as CEO/Founder Doug Austin, President Chris Veum and Principal Randy Robbins celebrate 30 years in business, together building the award-winning architecture and design firm known as AVRP, which is short for Austin Veum Robbins Partners

With a combined experience of more than 75 years, the trio of Austin, Veum and Robbins have established themselves as creative problem solvers and experts in their respective fields. They continue to blaze trails in the design industry with creative advancements in the areas of commercial, residential, and governmental building projects.

The trio has been responsible for designing more than \$3 billion worth of construction projects, including the new <u>Hoover High School performing arts theater</u>, multi-story classroom buildings for both Hoover and Point Loma High School, <u>Aviara in Carlsbad</u>, <u>Beth Israel Synagogue</u>, <u>Pinnacle Marina Tower</u>, <u>Red Door Interactive</u>, <u>Price Center at UCSD</u>, and several projects on the <u>USS Midway Museum</u>. The firm has been awarded several patents, including one for high-rise building design. AVRP is currently working on creating a new headquarters for one of the largest school districts in the country and an urban home from an old brewery.

At AVRP, established 46 years ago in 1976 by Austin, there is a focus on housing, education, healthcare facilities, as well as community and urban and regional planning.

"If you're looking for creative solutions, we're your firm," said Austin, who was influenced by The Universal Traveler by Don Koberg and Jim Bagnall, who served as mentors to Austin at California Polytechnic State University. "That's the ethos of this firm. I'm proud of our team and the work we've achieved and you can trace a lot of that back to the partnership between Randy, Chris and me."

Together, the three partners have helped AVRP earn nearly 135 design awards and have been recognized by their peers and clients for their visionary and innovative designs. The trio's commitment to excellence and their passion for designing functional and beautiful spaces have made them an asset to the architectural community and, more importantly, to San Diego.

Doug Austin

Austin, FAIA, LEED AP, MAIBC, is a renowned expert in urban design and has been at the forefront of designing projects both domestically and internationally. Some of his notable projects include urban infill, mixed-use buildings, housing, education, corporate offices, and healthcare facilities. The firm has come a long way since getting its start more than 45 years ago out of Austin's home.

Austin is a former Planning Commissioner for the City of San Diego. He served as Vice Chairman of San Diego's Redevelopment Agency, and he currently serves as Chair of the Advisory Board for YIGBY (Yes in God's



Backyard), an organization committed to finding innovative ways to build homes for low-income families and individuals.
